
Travel Information

Methods and Criteria for Comparative Theology

CONFERENCE IN AUGUST 2014 IN PADERBORN/GERMANY

More and more scholars are engaging in the emerging field of comparative theology with their own ideas about its nature and method. This gives us much reason to celebrate since we detect a growing interest in the field of comparative theology and in the related field of the dialogue of religions. However, it also generates an array of challenges, since many different approaches have to be taken into consideration and it is still somewhat unclear how to understand comparative theology. Moreover, we notice, there are only a few links connecting the efforts to establish comparative theology in the U.S. and Europe. At this time, engaging each other more thoroughly has become essential. Leading scholars in the U.S. and in Europe who are dealing with comparative theology, as well as those engaged in the dialogue of religions, need to strengthen their academic exchange and pursue attempts to bring their research into conversation. This conference is designed to highlight which criteria and methods should be specifically employed in comparative theology, and to provide tangible and successful examples of comparative theology. Essentially, then, the intention of the conference is a thorough elaboration of how to do comparative theology, showcasing its actual practice by established and younger scholars. It will therefore be not only a dialogue of different cultures of theology, but also of different ages and mentalities.
