with 100 % of the regular working hours. The position is limited for a fixed term of 46 month corresponding to the job profile within the approved project period. The opportunity for further scientific qualification is given.

The position is financed as part of an ERC Synergy Grant on the "Cultures of the Cryosphere. Infrastructures. Politics, and Futures of Artificial Cooling" (CultCryo), which, is an internationally highly visible research project. As a historical oriented Post-Doc you will be working in an interdisciplinary, international team at the forefront of cultural studies! CultCryo's overarching objective is to historically reconstruct and map the emergence of the "cryosphere" (the modern dependency on artificial cooling) since the 1950s and to analyze its dependence on cultural factors (norms, values, practices, time regimes, concepts) in four paradigmatic research fields (food, air condition, biomedicine, computing) comparing different world-regions. The postdoc will work on the energy history (particularly cooling) of digitization from the 1950s to the present day, with a focus on the emergence, dissemination, management and energy balancing of data centers. - Research in the context of the ERC Project "CultCryo"
- Contributing to teaching on the history of sustainability and digitalization
- Reconstruction of the energy balances of computing (data centers, use of information technology) from the 1950s onwards in three selected regions of the world (one of them is Northern Europe, especially Hesse)
- Data collection, archival work, research and study of specialist literature
- Preparing and analyzing research data for mapping the cryosphere (GIS) and the digital conceptual history (SCoT, DiaCollo)
- Cooperation with other researchers from CultCryo, particularly for the digital history of the concept of "digital availability"
- Contribution to the "Cryogenic Cultures Archive"
- Creation of (joint) scientific publications
- · Co-organization of and participation in project-related scientific events (regular workshops and internal team meetings)
- Presentation of project results at national and international conferences
- Project management, reporting-duties

Hiring requirements:

- Academic university degree (Master) in the field of history, science and technology studies (STS), media studies or related fields
