with regular working hours of 100 %. The position is limited for a fixed term of 53 months corresponding to the job profile within the approved project period. The opportunity for further scientific qualification is given.

The position is financed as part of an ERC Synergy Grant on the "Cultures of the Cryosphere. Infrastructures. Politics, and Futures of Artificial Cooling" (CultCryo), which, is an internationally highly visible research project. As a historically oriented postdoc you will be working in an interdisciplinary, international team at the forefront of cultural studies! CultCryo's overarching objective is to historically reconstruct and map the emergence of the "cryosphere" (the modern dependency on artificial cooling) starting in the 1950s, and to analyze its dependence on cultural factors (norms, values, practices, time regimes, concepts) in four paradigmatic research fields (food, air condition, biomedicine, computing), comparing different world-regions. The postdoc-position serves to critically review the manifold relationships between sustainability and digitalization, particularly in terms of the cooling/energy demands of IT infrastructures (data centers, cables, end devices) and corresponding politics (green IT etc.). The goal is to provide both an overview of the interplay of social justice and environmental costs of digital infrastructures for different world regions and to undertake case studies addressing the political epistemology of sustainable IT. Scope of work:

- Research in the context of the ERC Project "CultCryo" (90%)
- Contributing to teaching on the ethics and politics of sustainability and digitalization
- Critically review and contextualize policies of green IT, particularly for data infrastructures/centers
- Case studies on the sustainability of data centers/infrastructures, particularly in terms of social justice and data pollution
- Deconstruct the values, norms, and imaginaries perpetuating digital sustainability
- Add to a normative epistemology of cooling data centers
- Add to an analysis of the expectation of permanent digital availability
- Preparing and analyzing research data for mapping the cryosphere (GIS) and the digital conceptual history (using SCoT, DiaCollo) •
- Cooperation with other researchers from CultCryo ("computing", "values, norms, imaginaries")
- Advising team-members in analyzing values, norms, and imaginaries
- Contribution to the "Cryogenic Cultures Archive" (a collection of alternative ways of cooling)
- Creation of (joint) scientific publications
- Co-organization of and participation in project-related scientific events (regular workshops and internal team meetings)
- Presentation of project results at national and international conferences
- Project management, reporting-duties

- Academic university degree (Master) in either Science and Technology studies (STS), Philosophy, Media Studies or related fields
- Doctorate in Science and Technology Studies (STS), Philosophy, Media Studies or related fields
- Expertise around green ICT politics, political philosophy, ethics, social justice, sustainability politics
- A very good command of written and spoken English, basic German (or willingness to develop this)
